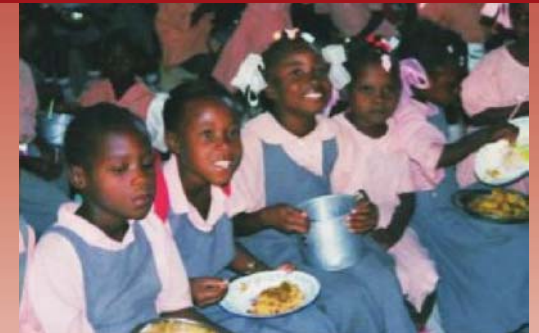

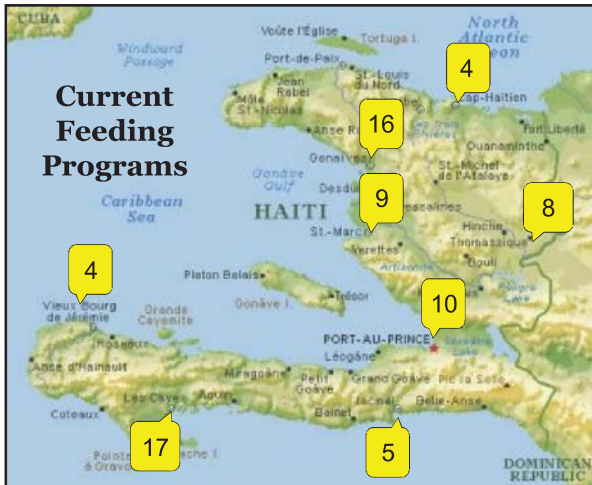
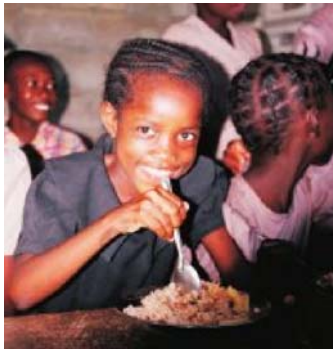

AN EMPTY HEART IS MORE PAINFUL THAN AN EMPTY STOMACH

Trinity HOPE started with feeding one school of 42 children in 1998 and has grown to include feeding programs throughout Haiti. For the 2010-2011 school year, 73 schools will be fed which will total 11,928 children per day. Children are fed a nourishing meal prescribed for the children by a nutritionist at Vanderbilt University to insure that children have the energy to learn and play. More importantly the children have HOPE for a future.



THE NUTRITION OF THE FOOD THEY EAT IS NOT THE ONLY NOURISHMENT THEY NEED

The Central Plateau area of Haiti is very poor and in the two main towns of Thomassique and Hinche, the children eat dirt cakes to alleviate the pain from empty stomachs. In many cases, there is no food to eat at home.

*35% of Haitians are Christians
This is up 15% in the last 10 years*



90% of the children in schools that have Trinity/HOPE feeding programs believe in Jesus.

They are taught in school about the love of Christ and when they see the food each day at school, they have positive proof that they are a part of His family and they are not forgotten.
